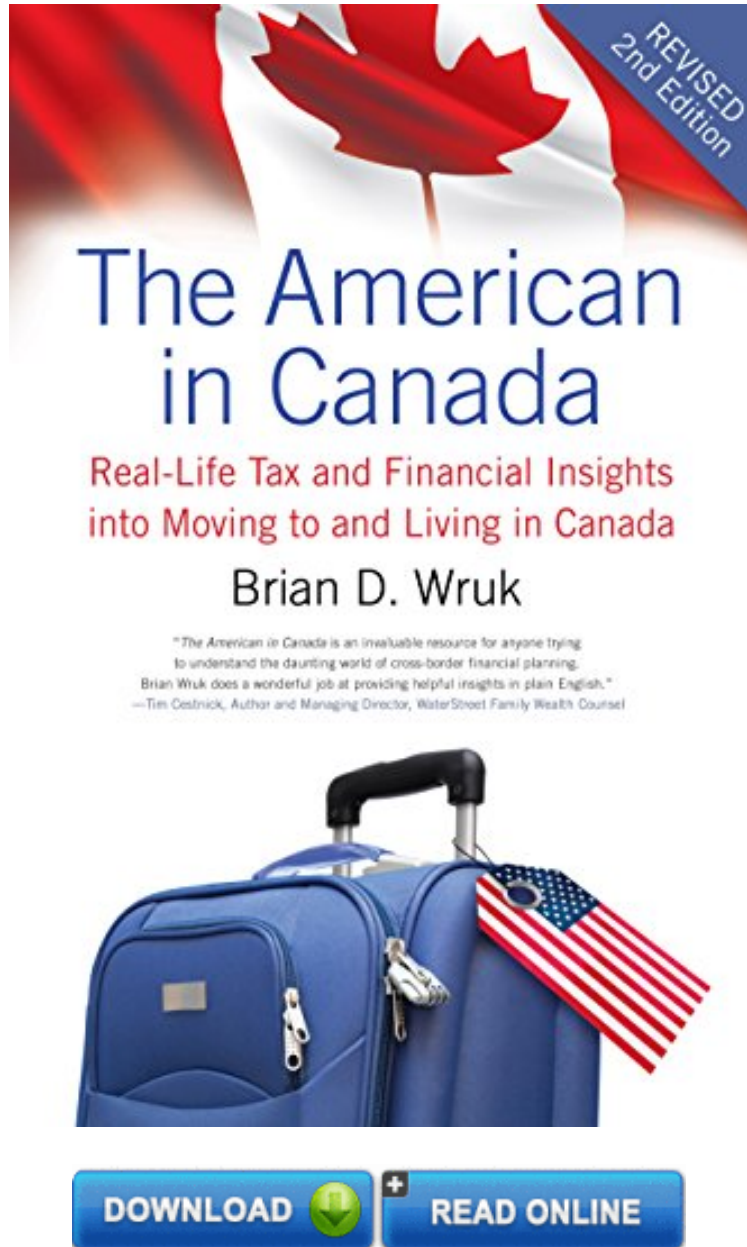

If you are retired and over 65 years old, you won't qualify for Canadian health insurance and would have to buy private health insurance.
