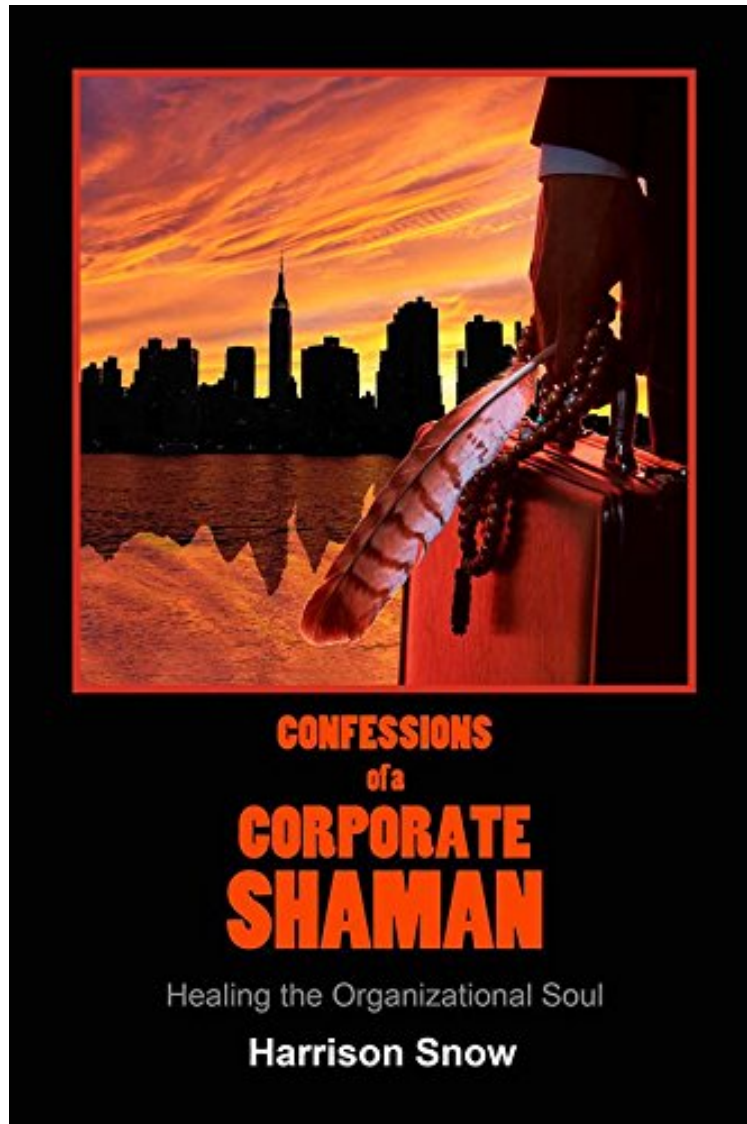

Second, although I am a therapist, not a constellation facilitator or coach, I found the examples of his work both moving and entirely creditable. Clearly, he knows what he is talking about, and I sense a deep respect for both the people he has worked with as well as his readers.
