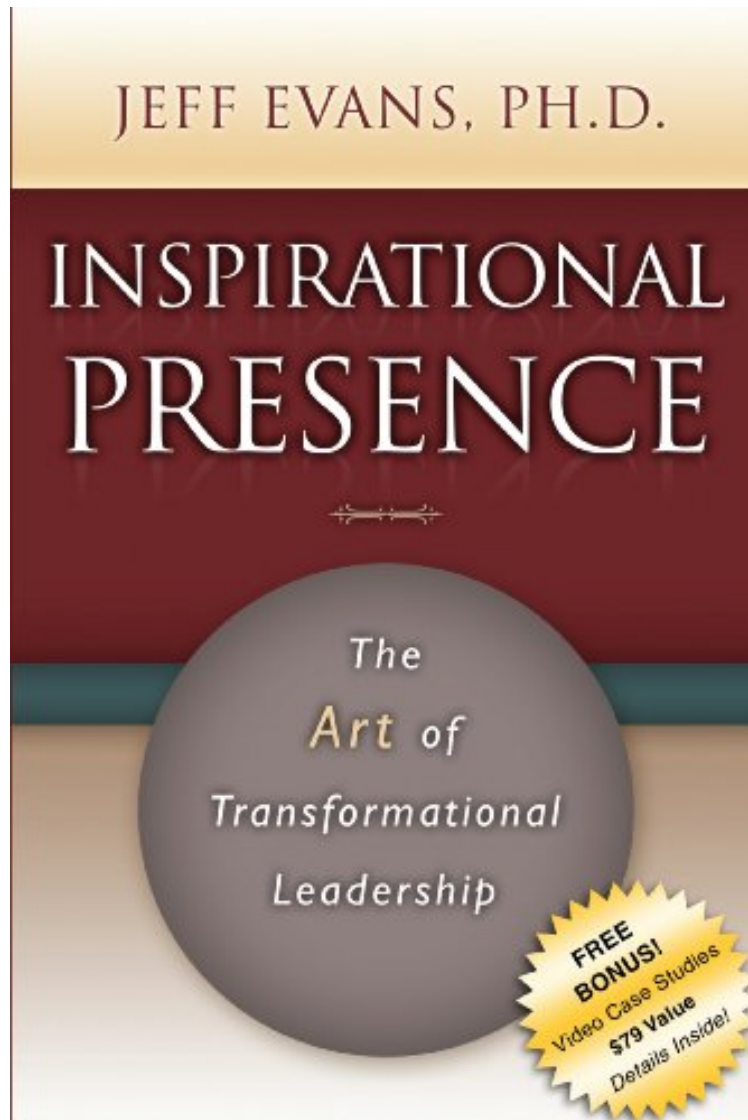

His style fits well with my way of learning: he states a proposition, explains it, gives examples, then moves on to the consequences of the stated proposition. And within these consequences is another proposition, and on he goes. It should capture your attention and interest and be easy to follow. The last several chapters are packed with valuable lessons and, for me, required some re-reading. He does offer a video supplement that can help.
